IN JULY 2015, we officially began our work in the Katanga Slum after 1 1/2 years of planning and getting to know the community. Sleeping on piles of old clothes, living in houses that flood with feces when it rains, gathering water from the polluted city 'gutter' stream and springs, safe water isn't easy to come by in Kantanga.

While performing our first monitoring visits in October 2015, we found that all of the families were sharing water with families around them and one woman even said, 'Thank you for bringing us GOLD'. Safe water really is life.







OUR STORIES

WE IMPLEMENTED five borewells in 2015. Typically, everyone is excited to be the first to pump the water once we open the project. But, at one school, a normally very outgoing young girl of 9 years was acting shy. We asked her if she'd be the first one to pump. When she got to the handle, she was struggling. We asked a teacher what was wrong and he said, 'this little girl, she's never pumped a borehole before. She's been gathering water from the swamp her entire life.'








